This publication lists agency activities requiring public notice. It also describes public comment processes and deadlines. Types of water use requests in this week's Public Notice include:

- * **Permit Application Initial Reviews, Proposed Final Orders, and Final Orders**
Applications for permits to use, store, divert or pump surface water or groundwater. Includes applications by the state Departments of Fish & Wildlife, Environmental Quality or Parks and Recreation for water to be used and kept in-channel.
- * **Applications for Allocation of Conserved Water**
Applications made by a water user who conserves water to use a portion of the conserved water on additional lands, lease or sell the water, or dedicate the water to instream use.
- * **Emergency Water Use (Drought) Applications (OAR 690-019-0040)**
Applications for emergency water use permits to use surface water or groundwater during a drought declared under ORS 536.740.
- * **Applications for Extensions of Time to Perfect Water Right Permits**
New applications received and proposed final orders regarding requests to extend time limits to fully develop water use projects and beneficially apply water.

Requests to change point of diversion or appropriation, place of use, and character of use upon which the public may protest the application and Department's proposed final order.

Requests to temporarily change character of use, place of use or point of diversion during a drought declared under ORS 536.740.
- * **Water Management and Conservation Plans**
Water management and conservation plans submitted by municipalities and agricultural water suppliers under provisions of OAR Chapter 690, Division 86.

- * **Water Management and Conservation Plan Progress Reports**
Water management and conservation plan progress reports submitted by municipalities under provisions of OAR Chapter 690, Division 86.
- * **Certificate Issuance**
Included in this section is a listing of recently issued water right certificates.
- * **Notice of Consideration to Convert HE 342 Instream**
- * **Renewal of Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) Limited Licenses**

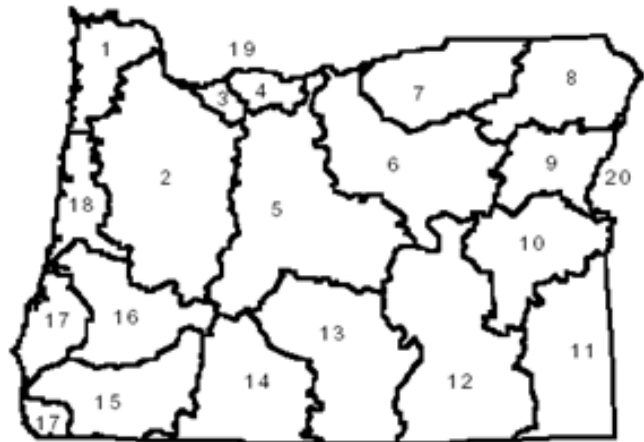

Permit Applications – Initial Review and Proposed Final Orders

The following pages of this notice list permit applications that the Department is evaluating for compliance with state water law. Public participation and comment is encouraged. Opportunities for public involvement vary according to the stage of the permit evaluation.

Initial Review (IR) Stage

The Department has given the applicant an initial review of water-use restrictions, water availability and other limitations that affect the agency's decision on whether to issue a permit. The Department welcomes comments from interested persons, agencies and organizations on the proposed water use. **The comment deadline for initial reviews appearing in this public notice is 5pm, Thursday, August 27, 2026.** Although we cannot respond individually to all comments, each will be considered as the agency makes its decision regarding proposed allocations.

Proposed Final Order (PFO) Stage

The proposed final order is the Department's penultimate decision on the water use request. The PFO documents the agency's decision through specific findings, including review of comments received. If appropriate, it includes a draft permit specifying any conditions or restrictions on the use. Persons interested in receiving a mailed copy of a PFO must pay a statutorily-required fee of \$53. (Any person paying \$53 to receive a PFO by mail will also receive a copy of the Final Order when it is issued.) PFOs may be viewed free of charge online at: <http://apps.wrd.state.or.us/apps/wr/wrinfo/>. Those disagreeing with the Department's decision as expressed in the PFO have 45 days to file a protest. Detailed information related to filing a protest can be found within the PFO.

The protest deadline for proposed final orders appearing in this public notice is 5pm, Friday, September 11, 2026.

If a protest or comment deadline falls on a day that the office is closed, then the next open business day automatically becomes the deadline date.

Applications for Allocation of Conserved Water

The following applications for allocation of conserved water have been received pursuant to ORS 537.455 to 537.500 and OAR Chapter 690, Division 18. In reviewing the applications, the Department will consider whether the diversion for the uses allowed under the original water right will be reduced by the conservation project, whether existing water rights will be protected from injury, and whether the project is in compliance with local comprehensive land use plans.

Notice of Application for Allocation of Conserved Water CW-150

CW-150 filed by East Fork Irrigation District (EFID), 3500 Graves Road, Hood River, OR 97031, proposes to install 6 large pressure reducing stations, 12 smaller pressure reducing stations, and replace approx. 63,754 feet of non-pressure rate pipe with 763,754 feet of pressure-rated pipe, eliminating overflows at the existing water boxes along EFID's Gilkerson, Winkleblek, Chipping, Dukes Valley Canal, and Chamberlin/Marsh sub-laterals. The project on the East Fork Hood River is expected to conserve approx. 2.4 cubic feet per second (CFS) and 576.0 acre-feet (AF) under Certificate 92000 with a priority date of Nov. 25, 1895. The applicant proposes 100% (2.4 cfs/576.0 AF) of the conserved water be protected instream in the East Fork Hood River benefitting both streamflow and water quality. The project appears to be consistent with the requirements under ORS 537.470. Any interested person may submit written comments for the application. Comments must be received within 20 days of the first day of publication, being by close of business on **August 17, 2026**. Comments should be sent to the attention of the ACW Program, Water Resources Department, 725 Summer Street NE, Suite A, Salem, OR 97301.

Emergency Water Use (Drought) Applications (OAR 690-019-0040)

When a drought is declared under ORS 536.740, the Director is authorized to issue emergency use permits to replace water not available under an existing right because of the drought. The Director shall approve an application for emergency water use upon findings that the proposed use will not cause injury to existing water rights and will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest. OAR 690-019-0040(3). In evaluating whether the proposed use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest, the Director shall consider the factors described in OAR 690-310-0120 and 690-310-0130; and

- a) The need for water because of the drought emergency; and
- b) The short-term nature of the proposed emergency use.

The following is a list of emergency water use permit applications recently filed, or which have recently received a final order, pursuant to OAR 690-019-0040. For any emergency use permits issued, the expiration date will not exceed the term of the Governor's declared drought or one year. The Director will consider all comments received concerning the use, or proposed use, under the emergency use permit throughout the life of the permit. (OAR 690-019-0040(4)(b))

Transfer Proposed Final Order

A Proposed Final Order provides the Department's conclusion as to whether a proposed change in place of use, point of diversion or appropriation, or character of use of an existing water right should be approved. Changes to water rights may be proposed in an application for transfer (including instream, exchange, substitution or ground water registration modification).

The Department has issued proposed final orders on the transfer applications listed below.

Newspaper Notice Requirements:

- **FOR APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED PRIOR TO APRIL 1, 2026:** In addition to this notice, the Department is complying with ORS 540.520(5) [2023 Oregon Laws] that requires publication of notice in a local newspaper for all transfers except those proposing a change in place of use only or a change in point of diversion of less than ¼ mile where there are no intervening diversion points between the authorized and proposed points of diversion.
- **FOR APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED ON OR AFTER APRIL 1, 2026:** In addition to this notice, the Department is complying with ORS 540.520(7) [2025 Oregon Laws c. 575 §§20,20a] that requires publication of notice in a local newspaper if the Department determines that more than five water rights would be injured as a result of the change proposed in an application.

Protests must be received by the Department on or before September 11, 2026 (being **45 days** from the date of this notice). If a protest is filed, any person who supports the proposed final order may file a request for party status to request to participate in any contested case proceeding in support of the proposed final order. Requests for party status must meet the requirements of OAR 690-380-2260(5) and ORS 536.077(2), including being accompanied by \$1,425 request for party status fee. Requests for party status must be received by the Department within 30 days after the deadline for filing a protest. - **Groundwater Registration Modification Applications – FOR PROPOSED FINAL ORDERS ISSUED ON OR AFTER APRIL 1, 2026:** Any person may protest a proposed final order to request a contested case hearing on the proposed final order. Protests must meet the requirements of OAR 690-382-0900 and ORS 536.077(1), including being accompanied by a \$1,425 protest fee for a nonapplicant and \$720 protest fee for an applicant. Protests must be received by the Department on or before September 11, 2026 (being **45 days** from the date of this notice). If a protest is filed, any person who supports the proposed final order may file a request for party

status to request to participate in any contested case proceeding in support of the proposed final order. Requests for party status must meet the requirements of OAR 690-382-0900 and ORS 536.077(2), including being accompanied by \$1,425 request for party status fee. Requests for party status must be received by the Department within 30 days after the deadline for filing a protest. Protests must meet the requirements of ORS 540.520(8) and (9) and ORS 536.077(1), including being accompanied by a \$1,425 protest fee for a nonapplicant and \$720 protest fee for an applicant. Protests must be received by the Department on or before August 27, 2026 (being **30 days** from the date of this notice). If a protest is filed, any person who supports the proposed final order may file a request for party status to request to participate in any contested case proceeding in support of the proposed final order. Requests for party status must meet the requirements of ORS 540.520(9) and ORS 536.077(2), including being accompanied by \$1,425 request for party status fee. Requests for party status must be received by the Department within 30 days after the deadline for filing a protest. For additional information concerning protests and requests for party status, review the information included in the proposed final order or call the Protest Program Coordinator at (503) 507-2749.

[T-14552](#) filed by Hans Nelson and Son Nursery, Inc. and Dan Nelson, 31020 SE Waybill Rd, Boring, OR 97009-9427, proposes additional points of appropriation under Certificate 50467. The right allows the use of 0.11 cubic foot per second from a well in Sec. 29, T1S, R4E, WM for irrigation in Sec. 29, T1S, R4E, WM. The applicant proposes the additional points of appropriation in Sec. 29, T1S, R4E, WM. The Water Resources Department proposes to approve the transfer, based on the requirements of ORS Chapter 540 and OAR 690-380-5000.

The applicant proposes to move the point of appropriation in Sec. 12, T12S, R5W, WM, to change the place of use within Sec. 12, T12S, R5W, WM, and to change the character of use to industrial. The Water Resources Department proposes to approve the modification, based on the requirements of ORS Chapter 540 and OAR 690-382-1000.

[T-13927](#) filed by Randy Glenn, PO Box 161 Summerville, OR 97876, proposes a change in point of diversion and place of use under Certificate 21537. The right allows the use of 0.98 cubic foot per second from Mill Creek in Sec. 18, T1S, R39E, WM for irrigation in Sec. 18, T1S, R39E, WM. The applicant proposes to move the point of diversion to Sec. 12, T1S, R38E, WM and to change the place of use to Sec. 13, T1S, R38E, WM. The Water Resources Department proposes to deny the transfer, based on the requirements of ORS Chapter 540 and OAR 690-380-5000.

Transfer Applications: Drought Temporary Transfer

During the effective time period of a drought declaration under ORS 536.740, the Commission or the Director may: (1) Allow a temporary transfer of a water right without complying with the notice and waiting requirements of ORS 540.520; (2) Allow a temporary exchange of water without giving notice as required under ORS 540.535; and (3) Use an expedited notice and waiting requirement for the substitution of a supplemental ground water right for a primary water right.

Notice of Consideration to Convert Instream Hydroelectric Project HE 342

The Department seeks public comments, on the following Notice of Consideration to convert water right HE 342 to an instream water right. Comment's must be submitted within 30 days of publication of this notice.

Renewal of Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) Limited Licenses

ASR means the storage of water from a separate source that meets drinking water standards in a suitable aquifer for later recovery and not having as one of its primary purposes the restoration of the aquifer (ORS 537.531). The use of water for ASR testing purposes requires a limited license pursuant to ORS 537.534. The requirements and procedures of an ASR limited license are different than those for limited licenses pursuant to ORS 537.143. Only after completion of an ASR testing program under a limited license may an applicant apply for a permanent ASR permit. The appearance of a renewal request in the public notice commences a 30-day public comment period. Following the public comment period, the Department may request additional information regarding the renewal request, renew the limited license, renew the limited license with additional conditions, or deny the request.

An ASR Limited License may be renewed if the applicant demonstrates to the Director's satisfaction that further testing is necessary and that the applicant complied with the terms of the limited license. The standards, findings and process used in the license renewal process shall be as provided in OAR 690-350-0020. The Director may renew an ASR Limited License for a term of not more than 5 years.
