Implementation of HB 2133 and 2135

1. HB 2133: Email correspondence. 85% of applicants are choosing this option.

2. HB 2135: Reduces Newspaper notices in 7 processes.

Continued Use of "Lean"

1. Instream Lease program.

2. Allocation of Conserved Water.



Office of Admin. Hearings

- Began with a WRD/OAH meeting to brainstorm opportunities for efficiency.
- Ended with the adoption of four strategies to improve the hearing process.

Water Right Layering Work Group

Supplemental = 3 AF Ground Water - Well

Primary = 3 AF Surface Water Source

Enlargement

20 Acres
