

# Scenic Waterway History

- 1970's-80's
  - Created to preserve, protect & enhance
    Oregon's outstanding waterways















# Current program

- Limitations
  - Dams/impoundments
  - Can impact <u>new</u> water right permits
  - Placer mining\*
    - Does not include "recreational prospecting"
- Some other land use changes subject to review process
  - Focus on visual impacts from river
  - Includes agency/public comment
  - Work with landowners to blend proposal into the landscape

<sup>\*</sup>Some exclusions apply (for example, recreational/non-motorized allowed)




# Why are we here?

- SB 401 (2013): OPRD to study certain waterways for consideration
- Governor asked OPRD to study 3 segments/biennium
- ORS 390.855 requires "ongoing study" with periodic reporting


### 1000's of waterways...where to start?

### Potential study list: coarse filter(s)



  - √Prioritize rivers for '13-'15 pilot studies
  - Review draft study reports




# Task force proposed potential study areas


### Pilot study waterways





### Eligibility study criteria\*

- Free flowing
- Scene from the river is pleasing
  - Primitive or rural pastoral
- Outstanding natural or recreational values
- Large enough to sustain recreation use
- Accommodate existing uses w/out undue impairment of
  - natural values
  - quality recreation experience



### Feasibility

- *If* the river qualifies, is there support?
  - Landowners
  - Local government
  - Elected officials
  - Recreational users
  - Other stakeholders
- Public outreach
  - Public hearings\*
  - Public comment period
- WRD & OPRD commission meetings





### **WRC Role**

- Flow adoption
  - Highest and best use
    - Quantities necessary for recreation, fish and wildlife uses
  - WRC "shall administer and enforce..."
  - Flow recommendation to WRC in November



### SWW flow impacts to *new* permits


- R: No dam or reservoir within SWW, but above OK if WA
- G: No impact unless proven to interfere
  - Mitigation required if 1% or 1 cfs exceeded of the average natural flow
- S: Scenic waterway subtracted from water availability
  - Not cumulative with ISWRs
