What Is a Reservation of Water for Future Economic Development?



- Sets aside a quantity of water for storage to meet future needs
 - Taken out of water availability
- Not a water right.
- Must apply to use the water.
 - Typical permitting procedures
 - Additional step: consult with ODFW and ODEQ

Overview of Reservations

- Division 79 = Process
- Basin Programs = Extensions

Division 79



- Establishes procedures to consider new reservations and extension requests.
- Last updated 1992/1993
 - Does not account for more recent statutory changes (1995/1997)
- Rulemaking for permanent rules for extensions
 - New reservation requests not included

Temporary vs Permanent Rules



Comparison

- Allows extensions <u>up to</u> 20 years.
- Extensions retain priority dates of original reservation.
- Same notice, hearing, public comment requirements.
- Not specified in Temp, but WRC is required to make decisions consistent with ORS 536.310.
- Perm: Streamlined information requirements.

Burnt River Reservation Extension Applications



- Burnt River Subbasin, North Fork Burnt River, and South Fork Burnt River set to expire March 8
- Received applications from Oregon Department of Agriculture for extension
 - Applications demonstrate continued need.
 - Department review finds consistent with ORS 536.220 and ORS 536.310.

Division 509 – Powder Basin Program Rules



- Contains the sunset date (March 8, 2016) for reservations in three sub-basins.
- Proposed rules would:
 - extend sunsets 20 years,
 - modify reporting requirements,
 - clarify that reservations are allowable / classified uses,
 - and address inconsistencies in terminology.

Division 509 Rulemaking Process



- Convened Rules Advisory Committee
- Noticed in January
- Held two hearings; took eight verbal comments (+)
- Received five written sets of comments (±)
