

Area of Concern

Background

- 1. Significant groundwater development
- 2. Protested groundwater applications
- 3. Staff reviewed groundwater level data and recharge estimate
- 4. Declining groundwater levels and significant allocation relative to recharge
- 5. June 2015 update to WRC



Need for Rule Change

With findings of no water available and with the potential for injury to existing water rights, the Department can not issue new groundwater permits.

In the summer of 2015, a Rules Advisory Committee (RAC) was formed to work on rules that would allow some permits to be issued with conditions if certain criteria are met.

Elements of the Draft Rules

- 1. Pending applications can be approved if offset water is provided.
- 2. South and Northwest areas: permit can be issued without offset, but with a condition that would prohibit issuance of a certificate.
- 3. Any new permits conditioned to require:
 - A. Dedicated observation well.
 - B. A water level decline condition.
 - C. Well-to-well set-back requirements.

Elements of the Draft Rules

- WRD will track status of groundwater permits, certificates and applications.
- Updates to the WRC beginning in 2017.
- a. Anticipate groundwater study to be completed by end of 2020.
- 4. WRD to provide: Quarterly updates to a Groundwater Study Advisory Committee jointly appointed by the Harney County Court and the Department.

Miscellaneous Elements of the Draft Rules

- 1. Eliminated obsolete water availability requirements.
- Added reference to a former surface water withdrawal of the WRC for consistency.

- 1. Sixth RAC meeting in Burns on March 1
- 2. Public Hearings in Burns and Salem, March 30
- 3. Written comment period ends March 30
- 4. Anticipate rule adoption April 13
