Background

- Reservation sets aside unappropriated water for future economic development in a basin; assigns priority date.
- Reservations in six sub-basins of the Hood River Basin are set to expire October 17 unless extended by rulemaking.

East Fork Hood River Eightmile Creek Fifteenmile Creek Mosier Creek Neal Creek

West Fork Hood River

Background

Adopt proposed amendments*:

- Extend reservations to Oct. 17, 2036
- Modify agency reporting requirements
- For any water right application drawing upon this reservation, require consultation with affected Indian Tribes (defined "Indian Tribe," "Consultation")
- Update rule language (note terminology & withdrawal)
- Expand classified uses of water (to include agricultural, commercial, and flow augmentation)

2016 Rulemaking Process

April 19: Rules Advisory Committee convened in Hood River (Attachment 3 lists attendees).
June 1-30: Written public comment accepted.
June 22: Public hearing held in Hood River, Commissioner Baumgartner, presiding.
Aug. 19: Commission action requested.

Public Comment & Department Response

- Attachment 4 contains written public comments, both suggesting edits.
- Attachment 5 contains verbal public comments, both supportive.
- The Department has made no modifications to the hearing draft.

Public Comment & Department Response

• Comments from the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Indian Reservation:

- More stringent consultation. Response: had already added definition of consultation, requiring it in the processing of any water rights that come in under this reservation.
- More stringent protection for the environment and for tribal water rights. Response: These are already accounted for in water availability calculations and water right permit application process.

Public Comment & Department Response

- Comments from WaterWatch of Oregon:
 - Oppose reservation extension, due to lack of reporting.
 Response: WRC had previously determined that faulty reporting was not a fatal flaw in the extension of reservations.
 - Supports several language changes that were made.
 - Suggest tying consultation with ODA found in OAR 690-504-0100(7a) to purpose of the reservation, which is economic development found in OAR 690-504-0100(1). Response: made no change; paragraphs are to be read in concert.
 - Suggest keeping the phrase "automatically repealed" in OAR 690-504-0100(9a). Response: staff recommends a change to "shall be effective until," to make consistent with language in Div. 509 (Burnt River), adopted by the Commission in Feb. 2016.

• Fix numbering in 690-504-0100(8), (9), (10).
