

Background

- Walla Walla Sub-Basin Groundwater
 Management Priorities:
 - Close basin to further groundwater allocation*
 - Increase basalt water use measurement and reporting by users*
 - Increase Department data collection, drill dedicated observation well(s)
 - Stabilize groundwater levels*
 - Encourage a voluntary, community-based, long-term, holistic water supply plan*

Work Since Last Meeting

- Since last WRC meeting:
 - Held 3 additional public meetings (Oct, Dec)
 - Met with counterparts at WA Dept. of Ecology (Jan 4)
 - Convened a RAC and held first meeting (Dec 12)

Current Rulemaking

Proposed changes to the OAR Chapter 690, Division 507 Umatilla Basin Program rules:


- Classify Groundwater in the Walla Walla Subbasin
 - Classify for exempt uses only
 - Don't exacerbate groundwater declines

Current Rulemaking

Proposed changes to the OAR Chapter 690, Division 507 Umatilla Basin Program rules:

- Establish a Serious Water Management Problem Area (SWMPA)
 - Require basalt water use measurement and reporting by existing users
 - Better understand the water budget of the basalt system

Proposed SWMPA Boundaries



Rules Advisory Committee

- 12-member RAC representing:
 - Basalt Groundwater Irrigators
 - Senior and Junior, Small Business and Large
 - Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation
 - Umatilla County
 - City of Milton-Freewater
 - Walla Walla Watershed Council
 - Walla Walla Irrigation District
 - The Nature Conservancy
 - Oregon Cattleman's Association

Rules Advisory Committee

Discussion included:

- Placing further limits on exempt uses? No.
- Expanding boundaries of the SWMPA
- Enforcement issues.
- Applicants seeking permit extension.

Next Steps

Continued scientific, policy, and community outreach efforts:

- January: Revise proposed rule language
- February 3: Convene 2nd RAC meeting
- Spring 2017: WRD continues field & data work
- Month of March: Public Comment
- Week of March 20: GWAC review and comment
- Week of March 26: Public hearing in the basin,
 Commissioner Eric Quaempts, presiding
- May 11: Bring rules to Commission for adoption
- Meters installed by Jan. 1, 2018

Next Steps, continues

- Staff continue to work with local basalt well users to discuss management options to curtail declining groundwater levels:
 - July 2017: Public meetings regarding sub-area boundaries
 - September 2017: Sub-area groups declare intention to draft voluntary agreements
