PHOTO LICENSES

The Department is considering including a photo on well constructor's licenses. This idea has been brought up at various times over the past several years. The technology has advanced tremendously in recent years and we feel this would be a good time to revisit the idea. The advantages to a photo license include being able to eliminate confusion in identifying well constructors and having a more professional looking license. The cost would be in the initial acquisition of the equipment and would not affect renewal costs. Photos could be submitted by mailing a picture in, stopping by the Salem office to have your picture taken, or sending a photo as an e-mail attachment. WELL CONSTRUCTION RULES UPDATE

As you may remember, the Department is currently working with a Rules Advisory Committee (RAC) in an effort to update the well construction rules. Some progress has been made. However, there are still a few issues that need to be resolved. Several subcommittees have been formed to aid the RAC in addressing those issues. It is the desire of the Department to have a draft set of the proposed rules available for public comment sometime this fall. WELL I. D. LABELS

Please remember to discard the well I. D. label when a well is abandoned. Do not reuse the tag. In addition, be sure to record the existing I.D. number on the

new well log whenever a well is either abandoned or altered.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS

Under federal and state law any state agency that issues professional, occupational, or recreational licenses or commercial driver's licenses must now require that the social security numbers of such applicants be recorded on any application, including renewals, for a license. The reason for obtaining the social security number is for child support enforcement purposes.

The current law includes well constructor's licenses. You will notice on current applications and the latest round of renewals that we ask those attempting to obtain a drilling license for their social security number. Refusal to give your social security number will be grounds for refusal of license or renewal of license. Your number will remain confidential and will not be used for any purpose other than child support enforcement.

TESTING HEADING EAST?

Contrary to Horace Greeley's advice, the Department is considering having one license testing session in Eastern Oregon each year. It would most likely be the April session and the most likely location is Pendleton. Please contact Mike McCord if you have any questions about this proposal. We would like to know how many people are in favor of the Department pursuing this further.

LICENSE RENEWALS

It is time again for license renewals! Renewal notices went out mid-February to all constructors whose license expires on June 30, 2000. A second notice has also gone out to those who had not yet renewed. STAFF CHANGES

WELL LOGS

A friendly reminder to please be sure your well logs are complete before you send them in. No one likes getting a well log back for

completion, nor do we like sending them back. The more common items forgotten lately are: incomplete information about borehole construction, amount and type of seal material in sacks or pounds, tax lot number, date started and completed construction, and maps with Monitor Well Reports and Geotechnical Hole Reports. Thank you all for your cooperation.

GRID UPDATE

The Department is preparing to release new software for electronically submitting well logs. The projected release date is June 12, 2000. The new software will simplify the process and provide for several enhancements over the current product. Since this is a major upgrade, the old software will be disabled by some of the changes that will take place. For well log access only, we are planning to upgrade the web site and encourage more people to use the CD-ROM distribution.
