

#### DRILLERS ATTACHING WELL ID LABELS

Drillers may attach a well identification label (tag) to an existing well that does not already have a tag. However, a completed "Well Identification Application Form" including the tag number with a note indicating who put the tag on the well must be submitted to the Department. The landowner should also be made aware that they will be receiving a "Well Information Form" from the Department which is to be recorded with their deed at the county clerk's office. ## WHERE OH WHERE DOES MY START CARD GO?

We still have some watermasters receiving start cards. As of November 15, 2001, start cards are to be submitted to the region office, not to the watermaster office.
