CONTINUING EDUCATION UPDATE

At their February 14, 2003, meeting, the Oregon Water Resources Commission approved adoption of the Proposed Final Rules regarding continuing education for well constructors. These rules were filed with the Secretary of State's Office and became effective March 14, 2003. RULES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Rules Advisory Committee (RAC) for well construction has had 3 meetings. Draft language allowing the use of Latitude and Longitude (GPS) instead of

Township, Range, Section, and 1/41/4 on well logs has been drafted. The RAC is also trying to clarify the slope stability geotechnical hole portion of the monitoring well rules. All draft language will go to public hearing where written or verbal comments may be submitted. No hearing dates have been set yet. The next meeting is scheduled for April 23, 2003, at the Salem office of OWRD. CONVERTING

As a reminder, if an 'other hole' will be used as a water supply well, monitoring well, or geotechnical hole or a geotechnical hole will be used as a water supply well or monitoring well, a driller must submit the

proper documents for conversion. Conversion of an 'other hole' is addressed in OAR 690-240-0030(2)(c). Conversion of a geotechnical hole is addressed in OAR 690-240-0035(4)(b). Conversion of a monitoring well to a water supply well is addressed in OAR 690-240-0100(2). All of the above are considered on a case by case basis through the special standard process. CALL BEFORE YOU DIG, OR DRILL

Before starting a drilling project or just digging in your yard, there are four important steps you should always follow to Dig (or drill) Safely: 1) call the Oregon Utility Notification Center at least two business days before beginning at 1-800-332-2344. 2) wait for the lines to be marked with colorcoded paint 3) respect the marks 4) dig/drill with care. This is a free service provided by utility companies statewide. This is not just a good idea, it is the law. For more information, visit the website

Notification Center at (503) 232-1987. You can't see them, but a complex system of pipes and cables lie buried under lawns, driveways, and sidewalks.
Accidental contact with underground facilities may cause hundreds or thousands of residents to be cut off from electricity, gas,

telephones, 911 calls, water and other vital services. Even worse, contact with these lines can cause serious injury. Drill Safely!
