Chair Reeves called the meeting to order and asked Commissioners and the audience to introduce themselves.

Meeting Orientation

Sarazin and Kim Ogren outlined the meeting's purpose and objectives, including having Commissioners discuss potential focus areas that the Department could pursue in the five-year strategic plan.

Overview

- A recognition of the tension between having a practical and aspirational plan

- Data collection and Monitoring/Management/Information Services
- Groundwater Hydrology
- Water Use Measurement and Reporting
- Dam Safety
- Field Presence
- Process Improvement
- Employee Initiatives
- Surface Water Hydrology
- Inter-Agency Coordination
- Business Operations
- Water Right Transactions
- Unadjudicated Water Right Claims
- Water Planning, Development, and Management
- Well Construction and Compliance
- Financing Water Resources Work

Next Steps

After discussing each of the topic areas above, the Department and Commission discussed next steps for strategic planning. The Department shared that after this meeting, it would start to narrow the list of potential focus areas or strategic priorities. The Commission, stakeholders, and agency partners will be asked for additional feedback on the narrowed list in order to determine a final list of strategic priorities.

Staff will report back to the Commission at it June meeting in Redmond.

Staff provided a brief update on efforts in the Klamath Basin.
