# Brief History

- The Stewardship and Conservation Awards date back to 1999.
- Awards were given annually until workload issues disrupted the program.



# Qualification Requirements

- **In order to qualify for an awards, nominees must meet the following criteria:**
  - **Be in compliance with all OWRD rules and statutes;**
  - **Be in compliance with all conditions of a grant agreement with OWRD, if applicable; and**
  - **Not have any violations or civil fines/penalties against them by OWRD within five (5) years prior to the nomination.**

# Qualification Requirements

- **The process of selecting the award winners was based on the following standards:**
  - **Percentage of water saved as a result of the project or program;**
  - **Effectiveness or creativity of the project or program; and**
  - **Benefit of the project or program to the community as a whole.**

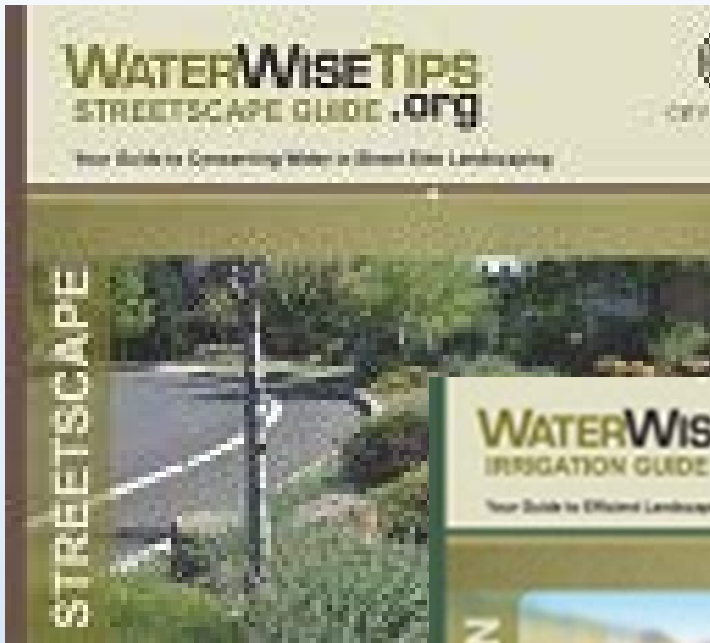

### Water Management and Conservation Program

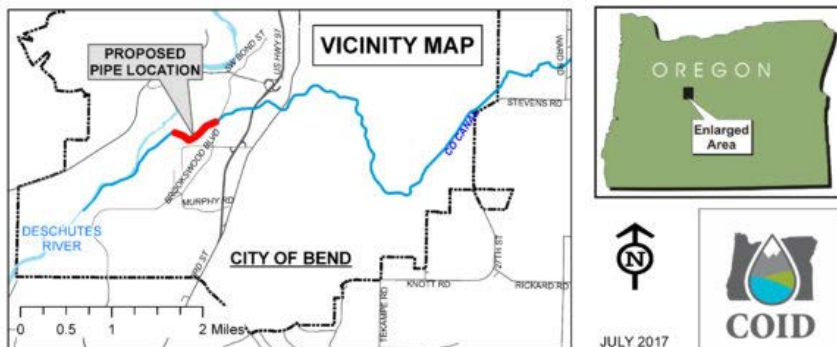
#### Curtailment:

1. **Water Shortage Alert (spread the word)**
2. **Serious Water Shortage (no fill of pools or ponds, encourage...)**
3. **Severe Water Shortage (limited landscape irrigation, etc.)**
4. **Critical Water Shortage (no landscape irrigation, etc.)**
5. **Emergency Water Shortage (total loss of supply)**
