TECHNICAL REVIEW TEAM COMMENT; WATER PROJECTS GRANTS AND LOANS – 2019 FUNDING CYCLE CITY OR PRINEVILLE AIRPORT AREA ASR PROJECT; PRINEVILLE, OREGON

Dear Ms. Williams and Technical Review Team:

This comment letter has been prepared to provide comments to the Technical Review Team (TRT) recommendations to not fund the City of Prineville Airport Area ASR Project for the 2019 Funding Cycle of the Water Projects Grants and Loans Program (Program). The City provided a detailed environmental benefit analysis that included the City leasing instream over 5,000 acre-feet of water annually to be released from Prineville Reservoir benefitting flows in the Crooked River from Prineville Reservoir to the confluence with the Deschutes River-further, flow benefits continue downstream into the Deschutes River, confluence of the Deschutes River and the Columbia River and to the mouth of the Columbia River annually. These environmental benefits are to be managed by the Oregon Water Resources Department (OWRD), Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) and any other interested agencies that may reflect a benefit of timed releases of stored water into the Crooked River to augment flow seasonally or year-round. Further, the injection of water to the Prineville Airport area aquifer has further benefits of augmenting groundwater development from this aquifer over time.

Based on the pre-application meeting with City personnel and Ms. Williams of the OWRD on April 11, 2019, OWRD personnel noted that up to a range of \$3.0 to \$3.5 million was likely available for the 2019 Funding Cycle of the Program. Based on a review of the TRT funding recommendations and the accumulation of 2019 grant awards funds totaling \$2,471,120, that leaves a value of \$502,880 to \$1,028,880 in excess Program funds that could be available to fund additional grant projects.

The City has considered the potential available Program grant funds of \$502,880 to \$1,028,880 and would like to recommend that the TRT could revise the award recommendations of the 2019 Program to include award of the remaining 2019 Program funds available. Considering the potential for the City to review funds in this range of \$502,880 to \$1,028,880, this amount could aide the City in reaching its goal of not imposing significant additional fees to City residents to cover the costs of installation of the City's Dedicated ASR Well #1 proposed for construction in 2020.
