## A. Approval of Minutes (10:00am-10:05am)

B. Request for Concurrence with Oregon Parks and Recreation on the Adoption of Management Rules for the Nehalem Scenic Waterway (10:05am-10:35am) Ken Stahr, Surface Water Hydrology Manager, and Oregon Parks and Recreation Department staff, Trevor Taylor and Chris Havel, will present a request for the Commission to concur with the Oregon Parks and Recreation Commission's decision to approve the management rules for the Nehalem State Scenic Waterway. *Commissioners will be asked to concur on adoption of the final Nehalem State Scenic Waterway rules*. #### C. Legislative and Budget Update (10:35am-12:05pm)

Racquel Rancier, Policy Manager, and Lisa Snyder, Administrative Services Division Administrator, will provide an overview of the 2020 Legislative Session and discuss budget and legislative proposals for the 2021 Legislative Session. *Commissioners will be asked to provide feedback on budget and legislative items for 2021*.

#### D. Preview of Rulemaking (12:05pm-12:30pm)

Racquel Rancier, Policy Manager, will provide a preview of draft proposed rules that will be upcoming for consideration of adoption at future meetings, including well constructor licensing for armed forces spouses, reservations of water extensions in the Powder Basin, and Deschutes groundwater mitigation rules. *This is an informational report*.

**Executive Session:** The Commission may also convene in a confidential executive session where, by law, only members of the press and Department staff may attend. Others will be asked to leave the room during these discussions. Before convening such a session, the presiding Commission member will make a public announcement and explain necessary procedures.

**\*Public Testimony and Written Comments:** The Commission encourages public comment on any agenda item. However, public testimony may be limited on items marked with an asterisk (\*). The asterisk means that the item has already been the subject of a formal public hearing or contested case hearing. People wishing to speak to the Commission are asked to fill out a comment request sheet (available at the information table). Comments relating to a specific agenda item will be heard by the Commission as each agenda item is considered. Comments on other topics may be made during the public comment period on Thursday.

Every attempt will be made to share with the Commission written comments that are delivered to the Director's Office or emailed to Nirvana Cook in advance of the meeting date. Early delivery of written comments is strongly encouraged so that Commissioners have sufficient opportunity to review materials prior to the meeting. To submit written comments during the meeting, please bring at least ten copies.
