The Special Standards Request Form you submitted for landowner: Portland General Electric, Start Card numbers: 1048524 through 1048529 is hereby approved for the following: You may decommission these temporary dewatering wells as described on your Special Standards Request Form dated August 12, 2020. All other well abandonment standards apply as required under Oregon Administrative Rules 690-220. Copies of your Special Standards Request Forms are enclosed.

The Well Construction Standards serve to protect ground water resources.
